## Declaration

Pursuant to the Thuringian Ordinance of 7 July 2020 in the relevant applicable update revising the necessary measures to contain the spread of the coronavirus SARS-CoV-2 as well as to increase the possibilities for action under the Protection Against Infection Act<sup>1</sup> in conjunction with the 5th Thuringian Ordinance on quarantine measures for arrivals and returnees to Germany in the fight against the Coronavirus SARS-CoV-2 (5th Thuringian Quarantine Ordinance) of 7 November 2020 in the relevant applicable update<sup>2</sup> as well as the corresponding General Ruling of the City of Jena of 19 November 2020 in the relevant applicable update<sup>3</sup>, the following regulations have been put in place for specific groups of persons (persons at risk), which also apply to participants in permitted University events that are to be attended in person:

1. Individuals who enter Thuringia from abroad by land, sea or air and who have stayed in a risk area at any time within 14 days before entry are obliged to go directly to their own home or other suitable accommodation immediately after entry and to stay there exclusively for a period of 14 days. This also applies to persons who travelled first to another state of the Federal Republic of Germany.<sup>4</sup>
2. Persons who have had contact with a person infected with the SARS-CoV-2 virus, and are therefore suspected of being infected, must report this immediately to the authority responsible for their place of residence or the place where they are currently staying. Until this authority has made a decision, the person is obliged to remain inside his or her home or accommodation and must avoid contact with other persons.
3. Persons who within the last seven days have exhibited symptoms of illness (raised body temperature of over 37.5° C, a dry cough, breathing problems (shortness of breath), pain in the lungs, acute loss of the sense of smell and taste, severe sore throat, joint pains) or who continue to exhibit such symptoms (even if they have not been abroad and have not had any known contact with a person in whom a SARS-CoV-2 infection has been established in the laboratory) are forbidden from entering the location of their professional or other activity while the symptoms are present and for seven days after the symptoms have ended (unless a laboratory diagnosis excludes a SARS-CoV-2 infection).
